- Expand the role by increasing board membership, implementing operational procedures, managing daily operations, and delivering community Safe Zone programs and education across four counties.
- Establish LGBTQ+ youth drop-in centers in 2023 and programs to support Gender and Sexuality Alliance advisors and members.
- Secure Anti-Stigma Grant through the NYS Office of Mental Health to develop an LGBTQ+ theatre troupe debuting in spring 2025 and an open curriculum addressing stigma and suicide prevention.
- Organize and facilitate the Safe Zone for Students Conference in spring 2023, certifying 75 students from all four GLOW counties.
- Create Act Out!, a youth leadership program that successfully hosts high-impact events like Karaoke Night, Gayme Nights, overnight lock-ins, and leadership training sessions.
- Orchestrate the Rainbow Resilience Conference at Genesee Community College in April of 2024 to provide mental health anti-stigma and suicide prevention training to 55 middle and high school students.
- Execute the Age-Friendly Grant, funded by the Health Foundation of Western and Central New York, to create comprehensive programming for LGBTQ+ individuals aged 55+, including intergenerational exchanges.
- Collaborate with GLYS of WNY and Niagara Pride to secure funding from M&T Bank, enabling Act Out! members to be compensated for their contributions to an advisory group beginning in 2025.
- Partner with Genesee Valley BOCES to deliver workshops and events, including GSA Kickoff Day!, Understanding Our Transgender and Gender Non-Conforming Students, and Safe Zone for Schools to over 200 educators and administrators.
